4 Set criteria for assessing the quality of curricula and aligning it with a QEP.

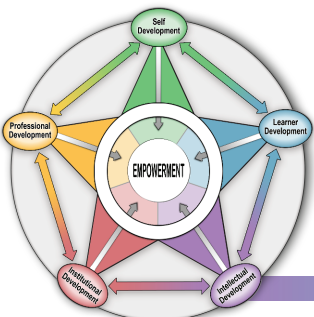
